

Homeowner Lead Abatement Information Sheet

On April 22, 2010, the Environmental Protection Agency adopted new laws concerning the abatement of lead based paint. These laws apply to residential houses, apartments and child-occupied facilities, such as schools and daycare centers built before 1978.

The EPA, not the City of Bloomington, is responsible for the enforcement of the lead abatement rules and regulations.

You will see in the guidelines that homeowners, doing their own work within their homesteaded residence, are exempt from these laws. The laws apply when you hire a contractor to do the work for you.
